## The Story of the Pie Bird

A pie bird is a small hollow figurine which when inserted into the upper crust of a two-crust pie, acts as a steam vent during the baking and as an ornament during the serving.



The use of these devices eliminates the need of cutting steam vents in the top crust, giving a more pleasing appearance to the finished pie. They are of course not required in the case of crisscrossed or perforated pie.

The figurines are commonly made of ceramic material and are painted in keeping with their design, with a paint that is baked into the ceramic. They can be made into any number of shapes and designs, but are most common in the form of the open-mouthed birds because of the nursery rhyme concerning the "four and twenty blackbird pie."
